

Ben Donenberg is the Founder and Artistic Director of The Shakespeare Center of Los Angeles (SCLA). As a director of populist interpretations of Shakespeare, Ben has built a reputation of creating excellent, accessible productions that are underscored by the canons of modern songwriters and recording artists. His production of Much Ado About Nothing at Center Theatre Group starred Helen Hunt and Tom Irwin and featured Lyle Lovett in the role of the musician Balthasar.

The production was supported by progressive bluegrass singers and songwriters Sean and Sara Watkins. Other Shakespearian productions include two productions of A Midsummer Night's Dream. One featured Natalie Cole and Obba Babatunde singing Nat King Cole jazz standards with text performed by Tom Hanks, William Shatner, Tracey Ullman, Geoffrey Rush, Christina Applegate, Rita Wilson, Zack Braff, and Kate Hudson (2006, SCLA). Ben directed the other for a Los Angeles Philharmonic's 1999 Fall Gala at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. Conducted by Esa Peka Salonen, it featured Mendelssohn's Incidental Music for A Midsummer Night's Dream and was supported by voices from the Los Angeles Opera and Los Angeles Master Chorale with text performed by Alfre Woodard, David Ogden Stiers, and Peter MacNichols. Other actors and recording stars who have performed in Ben's annual staging of Shakespeare include Sir Paul McCartney, Paul Simon, Sir Anthony Hopkins, Kenneth Branagh, Will Smith, Steve Martin, Cedric the Entertainer, Dule Hill, Billy Crystal, Robin Williams, Martin Short, Reba McEntire, Faith Hill, Tim McGraw, Ewan MacGregor, Jack Browne, Tracy Ullman, and Eric Idle. Ben's production of The Merry Wives of Windsor at UCLA's Royce Hall featured the songs of Hank Williams performed by Reba McEntire with text performed by Kenneth Branagh, Tom Hanks, Tracey Ullman, Rita Wilson, Martin Short, and William Shatner, who played Falstaff.

His presentation of As You Like It also featured Lyle Lovett, this time singing the music of Pete Seeger with text performed by Sir Anthony Hopkins, Benjamin Bratt, and Carla Gugino. Ben's Twelfth Night featured Peter Gallagher singing Gershwin and his The Two Gentlemen of Veronafeatured music by The Beatles. Ben has also directed more traditional outdoor and sitespecific Shakespeare plays for SCLA that have toured to venues throughout Los Angeles County. including Union Station, Pershing Square, the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, and the South Coast Botanic Garden. Ben has received local awards and national recognition from Actors' Equity Association, NAACP, Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle, California Educational Theatre Association, and the Mayor of Los Angeles. His 2006 six-year Presidential appointment to the National Council on the Arts was unanimously approved by the United States Senate. In 2012, Ben was selected by the U.S. Secretary of Defense to participate in the U.S. Department of Defense Joint Civilian Orientation Conference. He has lectured on theatre aesthetics at University of Southern California, and at the Huntington Library and SCLA's award-winning Will Power teacher training seminars. Ben received his Bachelor's degree in Philosophy from University of Southern California and is a graduate of The Juilliard School's Drama Division.



MICHAEL ROTH

Composer

Michael Roth is a composer/sound artist whose work encompasses chamber music, film scores and music/sound for over 250 theatre productions throughout North America. THE WEB OPERA (https://www.thewebopera.com), his acclaimed experimental online opera, composed and selfproduced to raise awareness of cyber-abuse suicide prevention, has been an official selection at 35 film festivals. WHY IMMERSIVE? A LOOK BEHIND THE SCENES

When choosing a show, we always start with this question: "why immersive?" These days, the word "immersive" is everywhere. It's a big buzzword that can mean anything from a selfie museum to a themed bar to a standard production of *The Lion King* where the actors run through the aisles at the top of the show.

In this production, we didn't want the immersive elements to feel like a cheap gimmick, but a purposeful ingredient — an "amuse bouche" to the main course.

Our goal for this show is to make Shakespeare accessible, fun, and engaging for ALL audiences – whether this is your first time seeing the show or your 100th. The text can be dense and hard to understand for people who don't have a pre-existing knowledge of *The Tempest*. So the intent of the immersive elements is used to serve the story, by cementing the larger themes, backstory, and characters of the show before it even begins.

We chose *The Tempest* because the show takes place (for the most part) in one location, in real time. And the magical island that Prospero, Miranda, Caliban, and Ariel all inhabit provided a treasure trove of opportunities. Who doesn't want to explore a mysterious, magical island?

Since we knew what venue we would be working in, we were able to tailor the experience to our surroundings. Instantly, the lobby became the ship and the main stage became the island.

We wanted to make the island feel alive – as if memories of years past have all imprinted themselves into the sand. So much of the show focuses on Prospero's side of the story, but how does the story change from the other characters' perspectives? Our preshow experience focuses on the characters who surround Prospero – specifically the three characters who have grown up on this island.




1st Draft Audience Flow Chart. October 2022. Sara Beil.
